¹ According to the Maternity Protection Act, it is forbidden to allow pregnant or nursing persons to work in the course of their university education between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. and on Sundays and public holidays. However, participation in educational activities between 8:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. and on Sundays and public holidays may be permitted if the pregnant or nursing person expressly gives their consent.

² According to the Maternity Protection Act, you are entitled to a protection period of 6 weeks before the birth and 8 weeks (12 weeks in the case of multiple births or children with disabilities) after the birth. During this time, you do not have to attend mandatory courses (internships, seminars, examinations). The university is required by law to offer compensation for this. If you voluntarily take part in courses or examinations in this period, you must submit a written declaration of consent (waiver of the protection period). You can revoke this declaration of consent at any time without giving reasons.
